CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

- Staff continues to work with the Atlanta Regional Commission to finalize a draft of the Comprehensive Plan Update.
- A Request for Proposals has been drafted to study recommended options and cost estimates for the renovation of the Public Works Building and property.
- The City is partnering with Georgia Power to use their Community Development resources. Georgia Power provided the City with a Community Profile, and a Traffic Count Map for North Clarendon Avenue. These documents can be viewed [here](#).
- The City awarded the contract for the Drainage Analysis project in the Clarendon Avenue-Berkeley Road area. Staff and the City attorney are reviewing contract terms.
- The City completed Phase I and II of the Historic Resources survey which was partially funded by the Historic Preservation Division. A picture of each property in the City has been provided along with an explanation of its prominent architectural features. The cut sheets for each property will soon be available for viewing at City Hall and on the City's website. Two survey reports were also created and will be available for review as well. The surveys will provide a benchmark for future planning activities in the City.
- Planning is underway for Chief Broden's retirement party. The party will be held on Tuesday, June 14, from 6-8 p.m. at the Avondale Community Club.
