



CITY MANAGER REPORT

Week Ending July 8, 2016

CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

- The City celebrated the 4th of July with its annual parade and fireworks display. Photos from the parade can be viewed on the City's [Facebook page](#). The City thanks all of this year's sponsors for their support.
- Staff attended a DeKalb County Service Delivery Strategy Open House for all municipalities. All DeKalb County departments were available to explain operations and clarify any issues.
- Mayor Pro Tem Giager attended a meeting with the DeKalb County mayors and Interim CEO May to discuss the proposal for distribution of SPLOST proceeds. There is a five-year chart and a six-year chart outlining the proposed distribution of the SPLOST proceeds based on a percentage for each city, derived by taking the larger population number from either the 2010 Census or the 2015 population adjusted by the Atlanta Regional Commission. Cities agreed to use these percentages, establish an Intergovernmental Agreement, and to approve the six-year option. The county will send city attorneys and mayors an Intergovernmental Agreement reflecting the adjusted percentages and the six-year option. Each city will consider the Intergovernmental Agreement and approval no later than July 15, using special called meetings if necessary.
- Mayor Pro Tem Giager, Commissioner Fisher and City Manager Brown met to discuss future possibilities of annexation areas and map for the upcoming Legislative Session.
- The June 2016, Financial Statement was reviewed. The total General Fund revenue for the month amounted to \$100,999.40. The total General Fund expenditures for the month amounted to \$281,518.72. The cash balance in the General Fund operating account, General Fund Reserve and the combined investments totaled \$1,847,275.59.

PUBLIC SAFETY

- Officers directed traffic for the 4th of July parade and fireworks celebration.

- A speed data report was conducted on Fairfield Drive, monitoring southbound traffic during the period of July 1 to July 7, 2016. The report revealed that 1,072 vehicles traveled the roadway at an average speed of 16.42 mph; 1,068 of the 1,072 vehicles were operating within acceptable limites.
- Officers directed traffic after storms which caused power outages throughtout the City.

PUBLIC WORKS

- Put up American flags to honor the 4th of July.
- Staffed the 4th of July parade and fireworks.
- Weeded flower beds around the City.
- Trimmed shrubs on Clarendon Plaza and South Avondale Plaza along with abelia hedges in rear parking lot of City Hall.
- Removed a dead tree from 41 Berekely Road, 15 Fairfield Drive, and the Berkeley Path along with, a low hanging limb at 22 Clarendon Avenue and 3048 Majestic Circle.
- Inspected a possible dead tree at 81 Dartmouth Avenue.
- Treated poison ivy on the Berekeley Path between Clarendon Avenue and Berekely Road.
