CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

- City Manager Brown and City Planner Stevens drafted a “Wish List” for the development on the former Fenner Dunlop site now owned by Avila; as requested by the Board of Mayor and Commissioners.
- An agenda and meeting format was developed by the Atlanta Regional Commission and City Planner Stevens for the next Architectural Review Board & Historic Preservation Commission meeting scheduled for March 1, at 7 p.m. at City Hall. - The required annual Census Boundary and Annexation Survey requested by the Atlanta Regional Commission and the Georgia Department of Community Affairs was completed. This survey ensures that the boundaries used for the upcoming 2020 decennial Census will be accurate.
- City Manager Brown and Communications Manager Revzin met to discuss reorganizing the City’s website. Completed changes were reviewed and continued improvements were discussed.

PUBLIC SAFETY

- The Avondale Estates Police Department (AEPD) provided traffic control for the City’s Arbor Day tree planting ceremony.
- Departmental training involving Taser re-fresher and re-certification was conducted at City Hall.
- A speed data study was conducted on North Avondale Road, monitoring northbound traffic with the speed display set in the “off” position. The study covered the seven-day period, February 10-16. The report revealed that 31,761 vehicles traveled the area at an average speed of 24 mph in a posted 30 mph zone; 31,749 of the 31,761 were operating within acceptable limits during the seven-day study.

PUBLIC WORKS

- Straightened leaning sign between 23 and 25 Wiltshire Drive, at the corner of South Avondale Plaza and North Avondale Plaza, and at the corner of Fairfield Drive and Exeter Road.
- Cleaned street signs along Old Rockbridge Road and the washout at the intersection of Exeter Road and Fairfield Drive.
- Submitted centerline data to Georgia Department of Transportation.
- Backfilled the right-of-way at 71 Berkeley Road.
