



## **CITY MANAGER REPORT**

Week Ending March 9, 2018

### **CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE**

- Staff attended the required Main Street Manager's meeting in Jonesboro. The presentation focused on grant funding options, some of which will be researched by staff.
- The kick-off meeting for Laredo Drive Supplemental Traffic Study was attended by staff at the Atlanta Regional Commission. An RFP will be drafted and a proposed schedule will be developed.
- Staff is working with the City Attorney on development agreements for the two (2) recent proposed rezoning applications. The first request is for property roughly bound by US 278, Hillyer Avenue, Maple Street and the CSX/MARTA to the north. The second request is located at the corner of Hobbs and Wells Street.
- A business owner requested assistance with issues associated with plan review. Staff assisted.
- A contract for the US 278 Redesign Project has been agreed upon. A schedule for the project will be developed soon including a public participation schedule.

### **PUBLIC SAFETY**

- AEPD Cpl. Serban is currently attending Supervision Level 1 training at the Georgia Public Safety Training Center (GPSTC) in Forsyth. The 40 hour course is the first portion of the agency required 120 hour training for Officers in Supervisor and above positions.
- Chief Thomas met with two representatives from the Museum School in reference to providing security and route guidance for the upcoming Museum School Fun Run and 5K race. The race is scheduled for the morning of March 24, starting at 8:30 am.
- Chief Thomas attended the first City Staff Operations Update meeting with representatives from all departments represented. Ideas were provided for the schedule of meetings and attendants moving forward.

- AEPD Command Staff participated in a phone conference/ demonstration from a vendor of a judgmental shooting/ range training device for future consideration for the police department training needs.
- Investigator Gillis attended the monthly METROPOL meeting held at the Ansley Country Club. There were a total of 16 agencies represented and the topic was general information sharing within the agencies and the commercial entities.
- A speed data study was conducted on Bromley Road monitoring northbound traffic with the speed display set in the “ON” position. The study covered the seven day period 02/23/2018 to 03/01/2018. The report revealed that 526 vehicles traveled the roadway at an average speed of 16 mph in a posted 25 mph zone; 525 of the 526 total vehicles were operating within acceptable limits during this study.

### **PUBLIC WORKS**

- Green spaces were mowed this week at N. Clarendon between N. Avondale Rd. and Old Rockbridge; the intersection of Covington Hwy and Nottingham Drive; the intersection of Covington Hwy and Memorial Drive; Fletcher Park; Sweetgum Plaza; Stratford Green; N. Avondale Road/S. Avondale Road along the abelia shrub; Berkeley Road/Kensington Road triangle; the old credit union building lot at the intersection of N. Avondale Road and Oak Street; removed the leaves and sweetgum balls that were in the path around Lake Avondale and the path that connects Avondale Estates and Avonwood.
- Removed the weeds in the planting bed at the intersection of Clarendon Ave and Clarendon Place, as well as the weeds in the planting bed at Stratford Green Town Homes.
- Filled the doggy bag stations around Lake Avondale.
