CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

- Staff assisted a resident with maps.
- The Atlanta Regional Commission requested updated City information. Staff provided the information available based on the request.
- Staff worked on the Rural Zone application due in August to the Department of Community Affairs.
- T-shirts in various sizes from Youth Small through Adult XXXL and yard signs are available for \$5 each. Previous years' t-shirts in a limited amount of sizes are available at two for \$5. PUBLIC SAFETY

- All AEPD performance evaluations have been completed and reviewed with AEPD Staff.
- Officer A. Preiss has been moved to Morning Watch to complete his next phase of FTO training.
- A speed data study was conducted on Kensington Road monitoring westbound traffic with the speed display set in the "OFF" position. The study covered the seven day period 07/04/2018 to 07/10/2018. The report revealed that 2,045 vehicles traveled the roadway at an average speed of 22 mph in a posted 30 mph zone; 2,039 of the 2,045 documented vehicles were operating within acceptable limits during the study.
