



New Residents' Guide

Welcome to the City of Avondale Estates!

George Francis Willis founded the City of Avondale Estates in 1924 after purchasing the entire village of Ingleside and creating the first planned community in the Southeast. The City was named after Stratford-upon-Avon, Warwickshire, England, and birthplace of William Shakespeare. Downtown Avondale Estates buildings were designed in a Tudor style to reinforce this image, as were many of the houses in the City. Avondale Estates is a City in DeKalb County, Georgia, with 3,360 residents. The City is known for its close-knit community, beautiful setting and diverse architectural styles. The first Waffle House, which opened its doors Labor Day weekend of 1955, is now a museum in the City. Community amenities for residents include beautiful Lake Avondale, parks, the Avondale Community Club and a private swim/tennis club.

Avondale Estates Police Department (AEPD)

The Avondale Estates Police Department is located upstairs in City Hall and serves the citizens of Avondale Estates. Calls are dispatched to the AEPD through the DeKalb County switchboard. For all emergencies, dial 911. For non-emergency situations, call 404-294-5410.

- **Request for Security Check** forms are available at City Hall and posted on the City website for residents who plan to be out of town. Download the form here: <http://avondaleestates.org/2189/Home-Security>. This information is kept on file with the police department, and officers will monitor your property while you are away.

- **NIXLE Alerts** – this service delivers trustworthy and important neighborhood-level public safety crime advisories and community event notifications directly from the Avondale Estates Police Department. To sign up for these alerts, go to <http://www.nixle.com>.
- **Citizen Patrol Program** – The Avondale Estates Citizen Patrol Program is a mobile neighborhood watch made up of citizen volunteers who serve as extra eyes and ears for the Avondale Estates Police Department. Their objective is to recognize and report suspicious behavior or activity and to deter crime by providing a highly visible presence in the neighborhood.

How does the Citizen Patrol Program work? The program is modeled after similar chapters around the country that have successfully lowered crime rates in their neighborhoods. Each day, pairs of volunteers serve two- to four-hour shifts driving a reconditioned police car marked “Citizen Patrol.” Patrollers cruise at slow speeds throughout the residential and business areas, looking for suspicious activity, behavior or situations. The volunteers pay particular attention to public areas such as parks, schools and the pool. Should an emergency arise, patrollers use a cell phone to dial 911 and remain at a safe distance inside the patrol car, even after help has arrived.

Board of Mayor and Commissioners

A shared goal of the Mayor, City Commissioners and City Staff is the dedication to improving the quality of life within the City. The best way to get to know and understand your City government is to attend a Board of Mayor and Commissioners Work Session or Regular Meeting.

Work Sessions include in-depth discussions of agenda items that pertain to City business and no actions or votes are taken. Work Sessions are held at City Hall on the Wednesday before the fourth Monday of the month at 5:30 p.m. During the Regular Meeting, the Board of Mayor and Commissioners vote on items that were discussed at the Work Session. Regular Meetings are held at City Hall on the fourth Monday of the month at 6:30 p.m. Public comment is welcome at the Work Sessions and Regular Meetings. Building Permits

Individuals engaged in any business, trade, profession, or occupation within the City must register and pay an occupational tax to the City of Avondale Estates. This includes home-based businesses. Historic District

Avondale Estates was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in December 1986 due to the character of the City's architecture and landscape, and because it's the only documented example in the southeastern United States of an early 20th-century planned town. Parking Decal

Recycling

Recycling is picked up in the City on Wednesdays by Latham Home Recycling Services. Please have your recycling out at the curb by 7 a.m. City Hall can provide you with a small recycling bin at no charge. Please call Latham at 770-554-0455 to purchase a 95-gallon recycling container. Purchase includes delivery.

Sanitation

The City provides twice-weekly sanitation collection, on either Mondays and Thursdays, or Tuesdays and Fridays, depending on your address. Please have your trash out at the curb by 7 a.m. View the latest sanitation information on the City website: <http://avondaleestates.org/2209/Public-Works>.

Sanitation fees are billed and collected by DeKalb County. This City fee will appear on the DeKalb County bill under *sanitation fee* and is included in the total amount due.

Vehicle Registration

Out-of-state tags expire 30 days after you move to Georgia, regardless of the dates shown on the tag. There are two exceptions: non-resident military members and full-time college students. Vehicle tags must be purchased at the DeKalb County Motor Vehicle License Tax Division located at 4380 Memorial Drive, Decatur, Georgia. Voting and Elections

Registering in DeKalb County to vote in county, state and national elections automatically registers those living in the City of Avondale Estates to vote in City elections.

City elections for members of the Board of Mayor and Commissioners are held every two years (odd-numbered years).
