
Plan: Create a Walkable, Safe & Attractive Corridor Connecting the Community and Catalyzing Downtown Development



North Avondale & East College from Sam's Crossing to Ashton Place Complete Street Description


- Three 11' lanes including turning lane
- 10' path for pedestrians & bikes on Northside
- 5' sidewalks on Southside
- New pedestrian and vehicle lighting
- Landscape buffer (Typical 5' strip)
- Center median (Typical 11')
- Ped/bike crossings
- Road repaving and restriping
- Replaced and upgraded traffic signals


Creating a Better Place Means Better Opportunities

- By changing corridor from a place that people “drive through” to one that they “drive to,” research shows improved economic vitality for local businesses.
- Replacing vehicle travel lanes with more options to walk, bike or take transit encourages people to “park once and visit.”
- Attracts millennials with changing travel patterns.




18 Seconds... Projected Increased Travel Time with New Alignment

Maintaining efficiency and mobility Important project priority



Slowing Speeds Saves Lives

- Speeds measured 10 mph or greater above posted speed limit
- Speed sentry data shows 56% of motorists travel over 31 mph.
- 150 crashes on corridor 2013-2017
